Plant Update

- Rob Nixon gave an update on:
 - Owens Corning Plant Operations
 - Another round of Stack Sampling is scheduled to take place this month (Oct. 24) and results will be reviewed at the January meeting.
- Brett Arnold provided information on:
 - Internal Air Flow Assessment was conducted in December 2018 and, as a result of this effort, the company replaced two general ventilation fans on October 21 in the furnace area.
 - The facility is again accepting deliveries by rail. He said there will be an average of one car arriving at the site each week.
- Megan Moore gave an update on:
 - Health and Safety
 - Step Challenge –Employees are participating in a "step challenge" to track and increase the number of steps they take each day.
 - Community
 - Habitat for Humanity The Owens Corning team will be working on a new project in the coming year.

 Mark Vanderlaan reviewed data results in the draft Ambient Monitoring Report for third quarter, 2019.

Regulatory Reporting

- Rob Nixon provided updates on:
 - Acoustic Assessment Report
 - Noise reduction efforts are underway.
 - Although not the purpose, the recent replacement of the two general ventilation fans in the furnace area will have a beneficial result in terms of sound abatement. Residents may have seen a crane on site in recent days needed to perform this work.
 - ECA Renewal Application, being submitted October 2019. Public comment period to follow.
 - Emission Summary and Dispersion Modelling Report.
 - Regulatory actions scheduled for 2020.

Community Hot Topics

 Craig Vallesi updated the group on Chamber of Commerce activities. The Chamber's Annual General Meeting will take place in November, where the group will look to fill three vacancies on the Board of Directors. Shakiba Shayani was named as the new President and Chief Executive Officer, effective Sept. 9. Ms. Shayani will be participating in future PLC meetings. Craig was invited to continue his participation and he said he would like to do so.

- Lorraine Pagnan commented on the road construction taking place on York Road. She reported that, in season, the Two Rivers Neighbourhood Association holds a local farmers market on Wednesdays from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m.
- Beverley Hale said the University of Guelph opened a new state-of-the-art \$18 million agricultural research facility for the study of cattle, specifically beef herds. More than 800 community members attended the grand opening.
- Rob Meyers reminded everyone that the flu season is upon us and recommended getting a flu shot.
